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**SUBJECT: MASCARO-RELATED REGIONAL LANDFILL RECEIVES DEP
APPROVAL TO OPERATE "ONE-OF-A-KIND" ON-SITE INDUSTRIAL
WASTE STABILIZATION/SOLIDIFICATION BUILDING**

Privately-owned waste service company J. P. Mascaro & Sons, founded and headquartered in Montgomery County, Pennsylvania, has an impressive network of DEP-permitted solid waste facilities to serve its many regional residential, municipal, commercial, industrial and institutional customers.

Those solid waste facilities include four DEP-permitted landfills, one of which is the Pioneer Crossing Landfill, the company's "Flagship Facility" in Exeter Township, Pennsylvania; three DEP-permitted waste transfer stations; the largest DEP-permitted sludge compost facility in Pennsylvania; and a number of recycling facilities, including its TotalRecycle facility in Berks County, Pennsylvania, a modern, automated single-stream recycling facility, serving customers in

the Five-County Delaware Valley Regional Area. All of those solid waste facilities provide critical support to the many Mascaro waste collection and hauling divisions.

Recently, on July 17, 2026, Mascaro's Brooke County Landfill, located about 35 miles outside of the City of Pittsburgh, received a major DEP permit modification that authorizes the facility to operate a large 11,000 square foot on-site waste stabilization/solidification building, whose principal function is to stabilize/solidify a variety of approved wet industrial wastes prior to them being disposed of in the landfill. Without such a stabilization/solidification process, the liquid content of the wet industrial wastes would make them ineligible for disposal in Mascaro's Brooke County Landfill or in any other permitted landfill.

Speaking to the major landfill permit modification, company President, Pat Mascaro, said, "I am extremely pleased that our Brooke County Landfill now has a 'one-of-a-kind' on-site wet waste stabilization/solidification building that enables us to provide a special stabilization/solidification service for a wide variety of industrial waste generators that qualifies their wet waste for final disposal at our landfill."

Mascaro added, "Generators of wet industrial waste are thrilled to have available to them a single permitted facility, like the Brooke County Landfill, that can first stabilize and solidify their wet waste and then provide for the final disposal of that waste, and our company is very happy to be able to provide this important service."
